The ACME *Uncovered* study guide raises questions about media, decision-making, and war. Regardless of your feelings about the Bush administration or the Iraq war, a democracy¹s survival depends on a trustworthy relationship between the government and the governed. The film and accompanying study guide argue that Bush administration officials violated the public's trust in building a misleading case for the invasion of Iraq.

The importance of media literacy and independent media become clearer when issues surrounding the legitimacy of the US war in Iraq come before the American people. And the work of organizations such as ACME, and its coalition, helps make additional information available so citizens can make informed decisions.

Additional independent coverage about Iraq and the war on terrorism is available in three new videos from the Media Education Foundation (MEF, online at www.mediaed.org), and the book Weapons of Mass Deception, from the Center for Media and Democracyboth ACME coalition members.

MEF Executive Director Sut Jhally explained: "We are living in one of the most critical periods history has ever seen, marked by a deep sense of anxiety, insecurity, and instability and media education has never been more important." Jhally continued: "We need open and public debate in this country about the relationships between media, politics, and war.....and the glorification of militarism."

ACME, MEF, and the entire coalition aim to build a vibrant, active media literacy movement in the US that will foster democracy, independence, and citizen involvement.
